PRIMARY DOMAIN:

Under the direct Supervision of the Supervising Psychiatric Social Worker, the Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) works in Medical Services, Integrated Care & Complex Patient Populations Division. The LCSW (CF) works within a correctional institution to provide clinical care and services to incarcerated individuals within CDCR institutions as assigned and scheduled. The LCSW (CF) conducts biopsychosocial assessments, risk assessments, level of care assessments, and screenings. The LCSW (CF) also provides clinical treatment interventions such as brief counseling, group therapy, individual counseling and crisis intervention as needed. The LCSW (CF) consults and collaborates with other disciplines for the care and treatment of patients in CDCR/CCHCS, and participates in interdisciplinary care planning and coordination. The LCSW (CF) performs assessments that assists with and facilitates transitional care planning that links patients with community resources and services as they release from CDCR.

Direct patient care: Conducts risk assessments to determine appropriate level of intervention (using NIDA-Modified Assist). Refers lower risk individuals to early intervention (Life Skills). Conducts level of care assessment on moderate to high risk individuals (ASAM Co-Triage) and refers to appropriate level of care. Conducts comprehensive, multidimensional assessment when indicated (ASAM CONTINUUM). Conducts Cognitive Behavior Therapy for individuals with Substance Use Disorder (SUD), either in 1:1 and/or groups settings. Conducts level of care assessments for patients preparing for release from CDCR (ASAM RISE). Develops and/or contributes to treatment and care plans.

Reviews patient files, gathers data, and completes reports and other required documentation. Initiates and participates in patient care conferences and prepares and presents patient summaries, and consults with other professionals. Makes recommendations to the care teams and effectively communicates and collaborates with the patient and all disciplines involved in the care of the

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patient; including community partners, agencies and other institutions. Coordinates with institutional rehabilitative programs and custody staff to link institutional services including education, training, work assignments, and special group participation to enhance patient adjustment to correctional setting. Documents and evaluates patients' progress with programming, and facilitates discharges and transfers in coordination with other treatment and rehabilitative programs. Works with institutional rehabilitative partners and custody staff to assess patient's participation and progress in services.

- Assists in recruitment and development of peer mentors and peer support groups. Participates in program evaluation and continuous quality improvement initiatives to support ongoing program efficacy and goals.
- 5% Attends all care conferences, trainings, meetings and committees as directed, and performs other duties as required.

KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES

Knowledge of: Principles, procedures, techniques, trends, and literature of social work with particular reference to clinical social work; psycho/social aspects of addiction, mental, developmental, and physical disabilities; community organization principles; scope and activities of public and private health and welfare agencies; characteristics of mental, developmental, and physical disabilities; current trends in addiction and recovery, mental health, public health and public welfare, and Federal and State programs in these fields.

Ability to: Utilize and effectively apply the required technical knowledge; establish and maintain the confidence and cooperation of persons contacted in the work; secure accurate psycho/social data and record such data systematically; prepare clear, accurate, and concise reports; work family and community agencies in preparation for discharge; develop and implement programs; provide professional consultation; analyze situations accurately and take effective action; communicate effectively.
