16. DIRECTION STATEMENT AND GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES

Under general direction of the Information Technology (IT) Manager I, the IT Specialist II will perform duties related to Software Engineering, including, but not limited to: Software Architecture, Software Development, and Software Integration. The IT Specialist II will be responsible for providing Solution Architecture and Application Development related services to create, maintain and support the front end software applications and web services to meet the various IT needs in support of the DMV's critical 24x7 infrastructure.

Solutions Architect and Developer (E)

Serves as a Software Application and Web Services Solutions Architect in projects and IT efforts that impact the DMV's public facing, direct access, service provider and internal applications. Consults and collaborates with ISD analysts, Front-end Developers, Back-end Developers, and Infrastructure support personnel to provide Software Application Solution Design and Development related services adhering to DMV's Application Development and Security Standards and Policies including creating technical documentation as a vehicle to share knowledge and mentor other members of the Framework Design Group and ISD. Creates estimates and schedules for Software Design and Application Development. Plans, manages and performs all aspects of customer service oriented support to internal and external customers. Communicates, both verbally and in writing, with users at all levels, from data entry technicians to senior management.

Project Management (E)

Provides leadership in facilitating and collaborating with both technical and nontechnical teams. Coordinates various project and IT efforts that support the Software Development Life Cycle (SDLC) including, but not limited to, requirements gathering, design, development, testing and implementation in an agile or non-agile project management practice. Develops the Software Design Document (SDD) that describes the solution architecture including the detailed design application components meeting the business and system requirement specifications and project timelines. Initiates necessary project/status meetings, creates meeting agenda, facilitates, records meeting minutes to ensure decisions are recorded. Designs and maintains project plans, issues logs and change orders. Manages assigned tasks within project scope and the change control process. Presents technical

solutions to management and decision makers by explaining complex problems and solution in understandable terms to technical and non-technical persons. Analyzes complex problems, weighs multiple solutions, and carefully selects solutions appropriate to the business needs, project scope, and available resources. Develops requests for access to required systems, tools and resources to meet project objectives and follow up to make sure they are completed in a timely manner.

Consultation and Subject Matter Expertise (E)

Acts as a consultant to provide subject matter expertise on Front-End Application Architecture related components including, but not limited to, development of Proof of Concepts (POC) for solutions related to software application components, web services, application integration, middleware technology, external interfaces including performance monitoring and tuning of these components. Researches industry best practices and works to integrate them into DMV's solutions.

Legislation Analysis (E)

Analyzes new legislative bills to identify and formulate IT solutions for business change requests, problems and/or challenges. Validates business assumptions for new CA Legislative Bills (Senate and Assembly) and internal business project proposals that impact DMV IT to make sure they are complete and accurate by facilitating discussions with the Business and the Technical teams across divisions within DMV. Creates a conceptual design diagrams to support the business assumptions for the Legislative Bills and internal business project proposals by facilitating design sessions with the Analysts and the Technical teams within ISD. Coordinates ISD teams to create complete and accurate design assumptions for legislative bills and proposals for cost estimating.
