Follow lesson plans and substitute guidance materials to provide instruction according to the needs of each student. Organize the working environment to support effective education activities. Provide student feedback.

15% III. Collaboration and Guidance for Student Learning

Encourage socially appropriate behavior and teamwork among students. Assist students in developing, monitoring and assessing education/career goals and learning plans. Provide student guidance and direction. Network with the Mentor Teacher and staff to ensure a safe environment in the classroom.
