30%	Under the general supervision of a Battalion Chief, the Heavy Equipment Operator's duties and responsibilities are:		
30%	*Operate heavy bulldozers, motor- graders, heavy-duty transports, trucks and other types of heavy machinery used in fire suppression work, road maintenance projects, conservation projects, wildland protection programs, facility construction and maintenance programs. *Safely operate equipment on steep, narrow, mountainous roads and under hazardous conditions.		
30%	*Under general direction of a heavy equipment mechanic, service and affect major mechanical repairs to heavy bulldozers, motor- graders, heavy-duty transports, engines, trucks, and other types of equipment. *Perform vehicle maintenance and repair which may include prevention maintenance service, tune-up, brake relining and adjustment, disassembly and assembly for overhaul, welding, limited body repair, and lubrication.		
15%	*Maintain other equipment used in fire suppression activities such as chain saws and portable generators. *Estimate cost of repairs and purchase automotive parts.		
10%	*Maintain both computer based and written records as well as written reports of work performed.		
10%	*Trains other fire suppression personnel in safe practices in the use and repair of heavy equipment, vehicles and machinery. *Work with or supervise both inmate and free personnel crews on fire line assignments, road construction assignments, forestry conservation projects and station/camp work projects.

*Read maps to understand type of terrain to be worked on and location of incidents and projects.

The incumbent is required to wear respiratory protection equipment (including self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA). The use of such equipment may place a physiological burden on the incumbent that varies with the type of equipment used, the job and workplace conditions in which the equipment is used, and the medical status of the incumbent. As such, Cal/OSHA requires that the incumbent be annually medically cleared to be fit-tested for respiratory protection equipment. This clearance process consists of a comprehensive medical evaluation including a review of the incumbent's medical history, a complete physical examination, and vision, hearing, spirometry, and exercise treadmill test.

The incumbent typically is required to perform psychologically stressful and/or physically demanding duties consistent with firefighting, disaster response, and emergency medical response, including working in isolated areas, walking or running on uneven rough terrain, and remaining on duty 24 hours or longer without a break while performing these duties.

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Job qualifications and/or conditions of employment: The incumbent to this position shall be retained for not less than a two-year commitment starting on the date of appointment. Any lesser commitment shall be approved by the supervisor to the incumbent. Must obtain a valid class A or B driver's license and complete all required training.
