EIS provides a full range of information technology (IT) services for the Department that includes Information Security, IT Procurement, Infrastructure, software development, implementation and support.

GENERAL STATEMENT

Under administrative direction of the Deputy Director, Enterprise Information Services (EIS), California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR), the Information Technology Manager II (ITM II) serves as the Chief responsible for the Unified Communication, Collaboration, and Contraband Interdiction (UCCCI) to assist the Department in its daily operations and its efforts to enhance the safety and physical security of its facilities using technology. The incumbent will be responsible for oversight of the following program areas: Video Surveillance and Scanners, Unified Communications and Enterprise Collaboration, Radio Communications and Managed Access, Perimeter Security and Forensic Tools. The incumbent will be committed to adopting the best practices of the information and law enforcement security industry as promulgated by the private, state, and federal entities.

The mission of the unit is to assist the Department in providing a safe and secure environment for staff to work and incarcerated persons to serve their sentence, conducive to rehabilitation. The incumbent's position will provide leadership and empower staff to perform the complex technical security research, implementation, and ongoing support of solutions in operational areas. This position will collaborate with other safety and security divisions within CDCR and provide technical security expertise.

Oversee the development of strategic plans for Unified Communications, Collaboration, and Contraband

- Ensure technical guidance and direction to project staff, institution management, program support staff, consultants, vendors and service providers to develop, implement, and maintain various scheduling, IT programmatic and fiscal tracking mechanisms are maintained.
- Direct the development of comprehensive work plans; coordinate work products/deliverables and ensure their timely completion; coordinate with EIS and other CDCR staff managers on the design, implementation, and ongoing support of contraband interdiction and unified communication technologies.
- Ensure CDCR IT resources, project and portfolio management practices related to the IT projects/programs are aligned with various state control agency requirements for compliance with the required practices and for training departmental staff on the appropriate application of the technologies.
- Ensure project integration, scope, time, cost, quality, human resources planning, communications, risk, and contract/procurement oversight.
- Develop and monitor methodologies to monitor and evaluate program effectiveness and implement technical adjustments as necessary.
- Manage and oversee technical projects and ensure day-to-day operations for the UCCCI unit, including implementation and continuous improvement of processes and procedures.
- Responsible for the preparation and ongoing updates of Budget Change Proposals and project documentation to controlling agencies.
- Responsible for UCCCI program fund allocation and its distribution, the budget baseline, monitoring, tracking, and reporting the state of the allocation to control agencies and stakeholders as necessary.
- Establish and maintain working relationships/partnerships with the support teams throughout EIS, other CDCR divisions, external law enforcement, and other state and federal agencies.

Contract Management

- Responsible for contract management of the system integrators and program support service contractors.
- Provide independent quality control and quality assurance review of technical deliverables from contractors, procurement documents, including purchase orders for acquisition of hardware and software, contracts for services, and service level agreements; manages all aspects of IT contract services.

 mutual cooperation by users, stakeholders and staff.
- Recruit and interview for unit staff.
