Under the general direction of the section Program and Project Supervisor, the analyst will consider issues around equity and disadvantaged vulnerable communities in the CPUC's climate and energy policy and programs. The analyst will coordinate with colleagues at other state agencies to support the Disadvantaged Communities Advisory Group, which advises the CPUC and California Energy Commission on clean energy programs. The analyst will also support development and tracking of energy actions in support of the CPUC's Environmental and Social Justice (ESJ) Action Plan. The analyst will generally perform equity policy research and analysis, advise colleagues and decisionmakers throughout the CPUC on energy equity issues, and coordinate with ESJ stakeholders including utilities. The analyst will consider diversity, equity, and inclusion in policy analysis, stakeholder engagement, and internal processes. This position was created by FY 16/17 BCP #5 (SB 350 Disadvantaged Communities).
