MISSION OF SECTION:

The Short-Lived Climate Pollutant (SLCP) Policy Section is primarily responsible for development and implementation of policies designed to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions from California's waste sector and natural and working lands. The Section is responsible for implementation of waste provisions of Senate Bill (SB) 1383 (Lara, Chapter 395, Statutes of 2016), oversees the Landfill Methane Regulation, coordinates with CalRecycle on the Organics Diversion Regulation, and supports development and implementation of division-wide initiatives including the Short-Lived Climate Pollutant Reduction Strategy and the Climate Change Scoping Plan. In developing and implementing effective policies, the Section maintains constructive and ongoing relationships within the California Air Resources Board (CARB) and across a wide range of stakeholders including State agencies, academia, industry groups, environmental justice advocates, and more.

CONCEPT OF POSITION:

Under direction of Air Resources Supervisor I, the Air Pollution Specialist (APS) position in the SLCP Policy Section of the Project Assessment Branch acts independently or as part of a team to collect and analyze data, reach sound conclusions, and develop recommendations for the control of SLCPs with a focus on the dairy and livestock sector. The APS applies policy and technical skills to evaluate existing and emerging solutions to reduce methane emissions from manure management and enteric fermentation. The APS plans, organizes, and carries out analyses, manages data efficiently, and develops clear, complete, and technically accurate reports in support of regulatory and policy objectives. The incumbent establishes and maintains cooperative working relationships across the agency and with other State agencies to assist in research and analysis of technical information pertaining to GHG emissions reductions strategies. The APS exhibits awareness of environmental justice and economic issues specific to the natural and working lands sector, communicates effectively, analyzes situations accurately, and implements appropriate courses of action. The APS also provides technical expertise to operate in a lead capacity for special projects and studies. Occasional travel may be required.
