45%	Under the direction of the Vegetation Management Program Assistant Chief, the Pre-Fire Heavy Fire Equipment Operator (HFEO) is responsible for: *Operates heavy bulldozers, excavators, skid steers, motor-graders, heavy-duty transports, trucks and other types of heavy equipment used in fuel reduction and fire suppression work, road maintenance projects and in other wildland protection and conservation project work. *Reads and understands maps and fuels reduction project prescriptions to determine safe and effect treatment implementation. *Operates equipment on remote, steep, narrow, rocky, mountain roads both paved and unpaved, and under hazardous conditions.		
25%	*Performs equipment maintenance and repair which may include preventive maintenance service, tune-ups, brake relining and adjustment, disassembly and assembly for overhaul, welding, limited body repair and lubrication.		
15%	*Assists mechanics in making major mechanical repairs to heavy bulldozers, motor- graders, heavy-duty transports, trucks and other types of mobile equipment.		
15%	*Maintains simple records and written reports of work performed. *Trains others in safe practices in the use and repair of heavy equipment vehicles. *Other duties as required.

Effective on the date indicated, the employee assigned to the position identified above performs the following duties and responsibilities.

The incumbent is required to wear respiratory protection equipment (including self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA)). The use of such equipment may place a physiological burden on the incumbent that varies with the type of equipment used, the job and workplace conditions in which the equipment is used, and the medical status of the incumbent. As such, Cal/OSHA requires that the incumbent be annually medically cleared to be fit-tested for respiratory protection equipment. This clearance process consists of a comprehensive medical evaluation including a review of the incumbent's medical history, a complete physical examination, and vision, hearing, spirometry, and exercise treadmill test.

The incumbent typically is required to perform psychologically stressful and/or physically demanding duties consistent with firefighting, disaster response, and emergency medical response, including working in isolated areas, walking or running on uneven, rough terrain, and remaining on duty 24 hours or longer without a break while performing these duties.

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Job qualifications and/or conditions of employment: **Two (2) year commitment may be required. Possession of the appropriate driver license is required upon appointment. Must successfully complete required training during probationary period as a condition of employment. May be subject to working nights, weekends, or holidays.**
