- Provides safety and monitoring in the Patient Computer Labs.
- Monitors and checks in/out state-issued flash drives; ensures appropriate use by each patient.
- Documents patient attendance in Computer Labs.

Horticulture

- Assists in the Horticulture Therapy Program activity area and support spaces.
