Job Summary

This position supports the California Department of Public Health's (CDPH) mission and strategic plan by advancing the health and well-being of California's diverse people and communities by protecting the public's health, promoting health and wellness, empowering the public health workforce, and enhancing services through agile operations.

The Senior Environmental Scientist (Specialist) (SES, [SPEC]) independently conducts environmental health surveys and reviews construction plans of adult and youth correctional facilities, state hospitals, developmental centers, schools for the blind and deaf, and other facilities operated

by State agencies to ensure compliance with federal and State health and safety laws, regulations, industry standards, and safe operating practices. The SES (Spec) works with the management and operators of these facilities to ensure safe and healthy operating conditions, provide training, and offer consultative services to correct deficiencies. The SES (Spec) provides consultative and professional environmental health services in areas such as food service operations, housing, vector control, water treatment, waste disposal, cross-connection control, medical services, medical waste management, worker safety, ergonomics, hazardous materials management, and other environmental health-focused programs. This position requires heavy travel up to approximately 75% of the time and may have overnight stays.

The incumbent works under the direction of the Senior Environmental Scientist (Supervisor) of the Environmental Health Services Section (EHSS), Institutions and Recreational Health Unit.

Essential Functions (including percentage of time)

- 40% Conducts environmental health surveys and reviews construction plans of adult correctional facilities, state hospitals, developmental centers, schools for the blind and deaf, and other facilities to determine compliance with federal and State health and safety laws, regulations, industry standards, and safe operating practices. Participates in entrance and exit conferences with management of the facilities to review and discuss the results of the surveys.
- 25% Prepares comprehensive environmental health survey reports that document and identify deficiencies observed during the surveys and provides recommendations for correcting those deficiencies. Plans, provides, and implements both the more complex and routine general and specialized inspections, investigations, or studies of environmental health and safety operations and practices. Performs preliminary and secondary analyses, research, surveys, and investigations of food service operations, housing, vector control, water treatment, waste disposal, cross-connection control, medical services, medical waste management, worker safety, ergonomics, and hazardous materials management.
- 15% Provides technical assistance and consultation to the administrators of State facilities to ensure program understanding and compliance with federal and State health and safety laws,

regulations, industry standards, and safe operating practices. Responds to inquiries from institutions, local enforcement agencies, or other interested parties. Assists administrators and environmental health professionals with the development of short- and long-term strategies to resolve environmental issues. Provides recommendations for corrective actions and may assist with the preparation of corrective action plans.

- 10% Prepares reports for each of the State agencies served by the Institutions Program. Coordinates and provides training for administrators and other professionals employed by institutions regarding proper environmental health management practices. Prepares technical documents or handouts for use by the administrators and other professionals regarding proper environmental management practices. Maintains a clearinghouse of technical information for contract customers, the public, and other interested parties. Prepares routine and complex correspondence, special reports, and other assignments. Prepares bill analyses, issues memorandums, controlled correspondence, and legislative reports, as required. Provides food safety certification course and administers food safety certification exams, as needed. Maintains current food safety certification.
- Serves as the principal program liaison with the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, Department of State Hospitals, Department of Developmental Services, Department of Education, and other contracting departments. Develops, negotiates, and monitors interagency agreements with the contract agencies. Assists in the preparation of the annual program, workload analysis, budget, and expenditure plan. Assists in the monitoring of revenue and expenditures for the Institutions Program.
