The Public Health Microbiologist (PHM) II provides technical leadership and assists in the planning and direction of work relating to respiratory and gastroenteric diseases including, but not limited to, diagnostic testing and reporting, training, and maintaining compliance with the CDPH's Viral and Rickettsial Disease Laboratory (VRDL) Quality Assurance (QA) and Quality Control (QC) program.

The incumbent works under the general direction of the PHM Supervisor (Virology).

- 40% Under general direction and guidance, provide technical leadership and assist in the planning and direction of complex diagnostic and reference testing for virus identification including, but not limited to, specialized cell culture procedures, hemagglutination assays (HA), Real Time Reverse Transcript Polymerase Chain Reaction (rRT-PCR), pyrosequencing, sanger sequencing, whole genome sequencing, functional enzymatic assays, and other complex virus identification methods. Assays performed will be for, but not be limited to, influenza, SARS-CoV-2, enterovirus, adenovirus, and norovirus. Maintain electronic laboratory results databases and utilize Laboratory Information Management System (LIMS) to report out diagnostic testing results in compliance with Federal, State, and Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) regulations.
- 30% Develop, monitor, and review QA/QC of testing procedures, including standardization of reagents, test controls, sterility testing, equipment performance verification and daily monitoring, and other QA/QC duties, such as freezer inventories, archives of stock virus cultures, cell cultures, and testing reagents and kits as needed.
- 15% Develop and apply complex, non-standardized analyses in assay development, including test standardization, validations, verification testing, general assay evaluations, and writing standard operating procedures (SOP) and laboratory protocols.
- 10% Provide technical leadership to, and plan and conduct evaluations of, local public health and clinical laboratorians by confirming results for referred specimens; troubleshooting laboratory problems experienced by local public health laboratorians; and providing technical leadership and guidance to internal and external laboratory personnel implementing new diagnostic tests.

## **Marginal Functions (including percentage of time)**

Assist in the training of local laboratory staff, microbiologist trainees or postdoctoral microbiologists, pathologists, and related medical personnel. May assist in the preparation of technical reports and manuscripts for publication in the scientific literature. Perform other work-related duties as assigned, including assisting other units or sections as needed for surge capacity.
