25%	<p>Under general direction of the Unit Chief, the East Division Chief for the Tahoe Basin and Alpine County area is responsible for providing administrative and operational oversight for activities within Lake Tahoe Basin and Alpine County, as well as the coordination of activities within a field battalion. Duties include but are not limited to the following:</p> <p>*Ensures close coordination among affected agencies as a result of the State Protection Adjustment. Works with federal, state and local cooperating agencies on the continued development of response plans, dispatch levels, mutual aid/automatic aid agreements, local agreements, assistance-by-hire agreements and the sub-geographical annual operating plan. *Monitors and maintains compliance with the Bi-State Governor's Tahoe Basin Fire Commission and its findings and recommendations, and provides input to appropriate entities. Assists in development of the annual report to the Governor detailing the progress and fulfillment of the recommendations of the Blue Ribbon Commission</p>	
20%	<p>*Performs Agency representative duties to the following agencies and organizations: Lake Tahoe Basin Fire Chiefs Association, Lake Tahoe Basin and Alpine County fire agencies, Sierra Front Wildfire Cooperators, Multi Agency Coordination group, Nevada Fire Safe Council, Alpine County Fire Safe Council, Lake Tahoe Basin Fire Prevention Officers, Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (TRPA), TRPA Advisory Planning Committee, TRPA Environmental Improvement Program group, Lahontan Regional Water Quality Control Board, Tahoe Fire and Fuels Team, California Tahoe Conservancy, California State Parks, California Department of Fish and Game, Alpine County government, El Dorado County government-Lake Tahoe Basin, City of South Lake Tahoe, Nevada Department of Forestry. Percentage of Time Required	Effective on the date indicated, the employee assigned to the position identified above performs the following duties and responsibilities.		
15%	<p>*Administers the Public Resources Code (PRC) 4291 program for Lake Tahoe Basin and Alpine County. Provides PRC 4291 training for Lake Tahoe Basin and Alpine County fire entities. Ensures uniform application of defensible space laws among agencies. *Administers a balanced fire prevention program; performs or assigns others to perform routine fire prevention inspections; makes public and external relation contacts at the appropriate level. Provides Battalion input to the Pre Fire Division for the Unit Fire Management Plan on an annual basis. Provides advisory support to local Fire Safe Councils.</p>		
15%	<p>*Supervises the Tahoe Basin/Alpine County Battalion Chief and oversees the Lake Tahoe Basin and Alpine County Division program, including the activities of the South Lake Tahoe Engine personnel. Supervises personnel that may be temporarily assigned at any time to assist with projects in the Tahoe Basin. Supervises Tahoe California Conservation Corps (CCC) Fire Center Battalion Chiefs and oversees the Fire Center program. *Maintains fire control skills and respond to emergency incidents as required. *Represents the Department as it relates to Cost Share/Cost Apportionment as required on vegetation fires</p>		
10%	<p>*Ensures compliance with the State's Forest and Fire Laws including oversight and enforcement of the Lake Tahoe Basin Defensible Space Program (PRC 4291), Land Use Planning and Fire Safe Regulation Coordination (PRC 4290), compliance with California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) environmental review of proposed public agency projects as well as the Z'Berg-Nejedly Forest Practice Act.</p>		
10%	<p>Performs or assigns others to perform regular inspections of facilities and equipment to ensure that they are maintained according to Department standards including facility safety inspections, equipment safety compliance inspections, regulated vehicles daily inspections, and normal vehicle maintenance service. Arranges for specialized personnel to perform maintenance work that is beyond the capability of station personnel.</p>		
5%	<p>Other duties as required.</p> <p>*These are the essential functions for this position. Essential functions are those functions that the individual who holds the position must be able to perform unaided or with the assistance of a reasonable accommodation.</p>

	<p>The incumbent is required to wear respiratory protection equipment (including self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA). The use of such equipment may place a physiological burden on the incumbent that varies with the type of equipment used, the job and workplace conditions in which the equipment is used, and the medical status of the incumbent. As such, Cal/OSHA requires that the incumbent be annually medically cleared to be fit-tested for respiratory protection equipment. This clearance process consists of a comprehensive medical evaluation including a review of the incumbent's medical history, a complete physical examination, and vision, hearing, spirometry, and exercise treadmill test.</p> <p>The incumbent typically is required to perform psychologically stressful and/or physically demanding duties consistent with firefighting, disaster response, and emergency medical response, including working in isolated areas, walking or running on uneven rough terrain, and remaining on duty 24 hours or longer without a break while performing these duties.</p> <p>*These are the essential functions for this position.
