30%	<p>Under the general direction of the Assistant Chief w/Differential, (Community Risk Reduction Deputy Chief), the Prevention Battalion Chief manages the San Diego Unit and County Fire Department Prevention Bureau.</p> <p>Specific Duties Include:</p> <p>*Coordinate and maintain a comprehensive unit-wide prevention program. *Supervise Fire Captain Specialists assigned to the Prevention Bureau. *Influencing fire safe mannerisms for 2.8 million residents and users of state protected lands. *Initiate and maintain cooperative relationships between the unit's fire prevention bureau and the San Diego County Fire Marshal office. *Provides the unit with the necessary materials and expertise to carry out its information and education mission. *Coordinates with Mexican authorities on the dissemination of fire prevention literature and other actions to increase fire safe awareness to non-English speaking persons. *Directs the unit's Volunteers in Prevention program.</p>	
20%	<p>ENFORCEMENT:</p> <p>*Coordinates and administers the Unit's law enforcement program. *Conducts fire investigations and prepares case reports for both criminal and civil matters. *Maintains working relations with other law enforcement agencies within the unit. *Administers fire investigation training for CAL FIRE and outside agencies as required. *Maintains ongoing analysis of the unit's ignition occurrences relating to arson caused fires.</p>	
20%	<p>IGNITION MANAGEMENT:</p> <p>*Develops and implements the unit's ignition management plan in cooperation with staff, field Division Chiefs/Battalion Chiefs, and pre-fire planners for the management of acceptable ignition levels.</p> <p>*These are the essential functions for this position. Essential functions are those functions that the individual who holds the position must be able to perform unaided or with the assistance of a reasonable accommodation.</p>

Percentage of Time Required	Effective on the date indicated, the employee assigned to the position identified above performs the following duties and responsibilities.	
20%	FIRE PROTECTION PLANNING AND ENGINEERING: *Plans and develops a fire hazard risk reduction program for the unit. Maintains familiarity with various laws, codes and ordinances relating to land use and development issues. *Provides direction and oversite of the Unit's Defensible Space Inspection program (DSI).	
5%	BATTALION FIELD COVERAGE and EMERGENCY ACTIVITIES: *Provide field coverage to the San Diego Unit Battalions in a partnership with all Battalion Chiefs (Schedule "A" and "B"). This includes direct supervision of Fire Captains, Volunteer District Chiefs (in coordination with district boards), Station Managers and Heavy Fire Equipment Operators, all CAL FIRE stations and any other local government fire protection within the battalion. *Responds to emergency incidents as a Chief Officer and may take command of incidents when so justified or requested. *May also function in subordinate ICS positions or other assignments. *At emergency incidents, guides all decisions and activities by governing department policies and procedures including, but not limited to, the Incident Command System and applicable training standards.	
5%	MISCELLANEOUS: Other duties as required.	
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Job qualifications and/or conditions of employment: The Unit expects a two-year commitment for all permanent assignments before granting transfer eligibility. May be required to work nights, weekends or holidays in support of emergency incident. Maintains the Arduous Fitness Standard in accordance with Department policy. The incumbent is required to wear respiratory protection equipment, including self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA). As such CAL/OSHA requires the incumbent to be annually medically cleared to be fit-tested for respiratory protection equipment.		
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
