GENERAL STATEMENT					
<p>Under the general direction of the Senior Psychologist (Supervisor), the Psychologist- Clinical (CF) will administer violence risk assessments pursuant to Title 15 CDCR, Division 2, Chapter 3, §2240 in support of the Board of Parole Hearings' consideration of inmates' parole suitability. Individual workload management and adherence to deadlines is crucial.</p>

35%	Conduct risk assessments of Life Term Inmates (Penal Code 5079). Review inmate central files and health records at institutions to obtain comprehensive background information regarding criminal and mental health histories; conduct forensic examinations of inmates for the purpose of determining inmates' level of angerousness and need for inmate risk management; administers structured risk assessment instruments and applies findings as required by statutes and policy.
35 %	Input risk assessment data into the board's information technology system, prepare written risk assessment draft reports, based on review of inmates' records and direct examinations of inmates; submit draft for supervisory review and consult with senior psychologist; edit and finalize risk assessment report
10%	Attends training relevant to clinical and forensic assessment. Participate in consultations with Chief Psychologist, Correctional (CF), conduct peer evaluations of risk assessments completed by other clinical evaluators and participate in other quality improvement activities to ensure the best possible compliance with the provisions of penal codes to maintain quality control of decision-making processes and procedures and evaluation performance standards.
10%	Periodically observes parole hearings in a non-participator role. As needed, attend hearings regarding these inmate reports and clinical determinations to provide additional clinical clarification; and provide other related information as may be required to assist the Lifer Hearings process.
5%	Perform problem-solving actions regarding Lifer evaluation issues; attend staff meetings; and perform other duties in support of Lifer evaluations as required.
5%	Perform administrative duties including, but not limited to adhere to Department policies, rules and procedures; submit administrative requests including leave, travel, and training in a timely and appropriate manner: accurately report time and submit time sheets by the due date.

SPECIAL PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS

- Influence, change, and strengthen the community. Set an example each day through positive and pro-social role modeling, utilizing dynamic security concepts through observation and building rapport.
- Willingness to play a significant role in the collaborative efforts toward rehabilitation and public safety enhancement.
- Ability to facilitate conversations as a coach and mentor, engaging in a respectful and understanding manner.
- Ability to build trust, improve communication, and assist with the transformation of correctional culture.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

- CDCR does not recognize hostages for bargaining purposes. CDCR has a "NO HOSTAGE" policy, and all incarcerated people, visitors, non-employees, and employees should be made aware of this.

CONSEQUENCE OF ERROR

- Example: Consequences of error may result in loss of time and could cause significant delays in program production. Such delays can result in inefficient use or misdirection of department resources resulting in the inability to meet efficiency and timeline goals, and varying degrees of negative financial impacts to the department.
