40%	<p>           Under direction of the Unit Forester, the Forester I – Forest Practice Inspector enforces the Z'Berg-Nejedly Forest Practice Act, Board of Forestry rules and Public Resources Code at the Butte Unit. Obtains compliance with rules, laws and regulations through field inspections, enforcement actions and consultation with timber operators, Registered Professional Foresters (RPF), landowners and the general public.         </p> <p> <u>Inspection and Enforcement</u>            *Inspects timber operations for compliance with the Forest Practice Act, Board rules, State Forest and Fire laws, and environmental statutes and takes formal or administrative enforcement actions as necessary. *In accordance with Department policy, inspects active timber operations for compliance and effectiveness. *Consults and establishes a working relationship with all responsible parties (licensed foresters, timber operators, landowners, and industry, etc.) for timber operations to prevent violations of laws and rules and requires correction when violations are discovered. *Identifies, investigates, and recommends appropriate enforcement actions for flagrant, severe, and chronic violations. *Develops site specific measures and actions to mitigate environmental damage resulting from violations.         </p> <p>           *Inspects completed timber operations for compliance with stream protection, erosion, slash treatment, stocking and other rules as related to the specific harvest document. *Conducts stocking sampling when necessary to assure compliance with Forest Practice Act and Board rule stocking requirements.         </p> <p>           *Initiates Forest Practice enforcement action when necessary and compiles evidence, reports, and recommendations for those actions. *Issues citations or files complaints for misdemeanor violations and appears in court as the principle or expert witness for the State in its actions in accordance with local, state, and federal rules, laws, and regulations. Investigates complaints and cooperates with Department civil actions, other agency law enforcement efforts, and RPF disciplinary actions.         </p> <p>           *These are the essential functions for this position. 20%	<p><u>Harvest Document Review</u>                  Receives, reads, and reviews all harvest documents assigned for designated work area or by the supervisor. *Reviews all timber harvest plans, Non-Industrial Timber Management Plans (NTMP), and plan amendments and conducts pre-harvest inspections as needed, and provides recommendations to the Director to ensure conformance with the Forest Practice Act and Board of the rules. *Coordinates, plans, and conducts pre-harvest inspections in the field with representative and recommendations for changes to bring plans into conformance with the Forest Practice Act and Board rules.</p>
20%	<p><u>Program Administration</u>                  *Writes inspection reports and related documents, compiles and maintains administrative reports, maintain records, answer correspondence, speak before groups and participate in meetings in connection with forest practice matters.</p>
15%	<p><u>Resource Management Programs</u>                  *Provides direct oversight of the Forest Practice program within the Butte Unit's Administrative boundary. Assists with the California Forest Improvement Program related to public requests for forestry expertise. Coordinates with County Planning Department on matters related to timber harvesting and timberland conversion. Reports through chain of command to immediate supervisor for all Resource Management matters.</p>
5%	<p><u>Other</u>                  *Responds to emergency incidents as required per Incident Command System (ICS) qualifications. Maintains proficiency, qualification, and experience standards including but not limited to the Incident Command System-Position Qualification System in accordance with applicable laws, rules, and departmental policy.                   *Completes Resource Management training per Procedures Handbook Section 4000 exhibits for Forester I and Forester I-Forest Practice. Desired knowledge and abilities

The Forest Practice Inspector must have good knowledge of forest management principles and practices, forest protection and fire prevention, timber inventory methods, appraisal of forest lands and timber, management plans, forest products harvesting and sales, forest mensuration principles and practices, timber stand improvement, the fundamentals of land surveying and forest ecology. Also required is a thorough knowledge of the Forest Practice Act, Board rules, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), other State and Federal Environmental, Forest, and Fire Laws. The Forest Practice Inspector must have a good working knowledge of law enforcement principles and techniques.

The incumbent is required to wear respiratory protection equipment (including self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA). The use of such equipment may place a physiological burden on the incumbent that varies with the type of equipment used, the job and workplace conditions in which the equipment is used, and the medical status of the incumbent. As such, the California Occupational Safety and Health Administration (Cal/OSHA) requires that the incumbent be annually medically cleared to be fit-tested for respiratory protection equipment. This clearance process consists of a comprehensive medical evaluation including a review of the incumbent's medical history, a complete physical examination, and vision, hearing, spirometry, and exercise treadmill test.

The incumbent typically is required to perform psychologically stressful and/or physically demanding duties consistent with firefighting, disaster response, and emergency medical response, including working in isolated areas, walking or running on uneven, rough terrain, and remaining on duty 24 hours or longer without a break while performing these duties.

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Job qualifications and/or conditions of employment: Registered Professional Forester License required. Completes CAL FIRE Firefighter Academy (FFA) and Company Officer Academy (COA) training during probationary period as a condition of employment. Maintains the Arduous Fitness Standard in accordance with department policy. May be required to obtain and maintain status as a Department Public Officer or Peace Officer. May be subject to working nights, weekends or holidays in support of emergency incidents. A two (2) year commitment to Butte Unit is required.
