25%	Under general direction of the South Division Assistant Chief, the Stationary Engineer performs a variety of skilled work in the operation, maintenance, and repair of the facilities at Valley View Fire Center.		
20%	*Operates, inspects, maintains, and repairs all water and wastewater treatment systems per California Code of Regulations (CCR) Title 17, 22 and 23, including piping, pumps, ponds, tanks, and spray fields. *Operates, maintains, and repairs water and sewage systems, trash pumps, spray fields, septic tank diversions, distribution systems and lift stations; laundry, baking and culinary equipment; inspects and trouble shoots electrical and mechanical systems and equipment to identify and anticipate necessary repairs. *Maintain and repair facilities at a Fire Center including, but not limited to; Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC), mechanical and electrical system, plumbing, fire alarm systems, all control panels, natural and Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) gas distribution and storage systems, buildings, and grounds. Track and inspect fire extinguishers and eye wash stations.		
10%	*Performs daily tests of water and sewage in various stages of treatment. Creates analysis of tests and report problems to the Fire Center Division Chief. Prepares and submits documentation and reports to Department of Health and Human Services, Water Quality Control Board and other control agencies as required.		
10%	*Performs minor building maintenance and repair, plan layouts, and estimates cost of electrical, mechanical systems; requisitions parts, supplies and equipment, calculates systems requirements to provide estimates for modifications or replacement of systems.		
	Prepares parts and materials lists, obtains cost estimates, and purchases parts for equipment and system repair. In accordance with approved mechanical plans, makes material lists and installs equipment and appliances.

10%	*Uses current knowledge of Uniform Building Code, Uniform Plumbing Code, National Electrical Code, Uniform Mechanical Code to construct and repair facilities and equipment per the codes set forth in these manuals.
10%	*Prepares facilities and reports for control agency audits California State Fire Marshal (CSFM), Environmental Health, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR), and California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE). Works closely with region and headquarters technical services staff to ensure compliance with federal and state codes and regulations governing the facility. Assists with the completion of the bi-annual facilities inspection and coordinate repairs (CDF-66) Coordinate Safety Data Sheet (SDS) program with the Fire Center Division Chief.
10%	*Assist in the management of the water and sewer budget for the Fire Center. Prepares and processes purchase documents necessary to maintain facilities systems, tools, and equipment in the Financial Information System for California (Fi\$Cal).
5%	*May be required to perform support functions on emergency incidents. This may include operation of Mobile Kitchen Unit/Meals on Wheels, Staging Area Manager, and relief driver. Other duties as required.
	<p>The incumbent is required to wear respiratory protection equipment (including self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA). The use of such equipment may place a physiological burden on the incumbent that varies with the type of equipment used, and the medical status of the incumbent. As such, Cal/OSHA requires that the incumbent be annually medically cleared to be fit-tested for respiratory protection equipment.
