40%	<p>The Fire Captain (Paramedic) (FC-P) works under the supervision and direction of a Battalion Chief (BC) and in cooperation with the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Coordinator; and due to the nature of their assignment, may be moved between stations in the unit to maintain required staffing.</p> <p>Duties include but are not limited to:</p> <p>*While responding to all-hazard incident in the pre-hospital setting, will provide Advanced Life Support (ALS) Services in all-hazard incidents; *Assure the ALS tools, apparatus and equipment are clean and in a constant state of readiness. *Operate emergency and ALS equipment and apparatus in a safe and efficient manner while responding to, at the scene of, and during special rescue and extrication work. *Is responsible in maintaining the required Basic Life Support (BLS) and ALS compliment for each apparatus at the station. *Monitor the inventory and replacement of supplies and equipment at the station. *Assure adherence to Department, State and County policies and procedures including, but not limited to: patient care, controlled substance storage/security/use, firefighter safety, emergency preparedness and response, and labor laws. *Is essential in the development and review of station budgets, including medical, rescue, and firefighting and routine station material. *Maintain all related certifications and accreditations as required by the SLU, San Luis Obispo (SLO) County Emergency Medical Services Authority (EMSA) and CAL FIRE policies, including the job classification. *Provide direction and coordinate the subordinates mandated and required medical certifications and training as it relates to their job classification. *Provide direction and coordinate aspects of patient care through use of, but not limited to: monitoring electronic Patient Care Reports (ePCR's), Quality Assurance/Quality Improvement Program (QA/QI) and through communications with the SLU, EMS Coordinator, as necessary.</p> <p>*These are the essential functions for this position. Essential functions are those functions that the individual who holds the position must be able to perform unaided or with the assistance of a reasonable accommodation.</p>

The incumbent is required to wear respiratory protection equipment, including self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA). As such, CALOSHA requires the incumbent to be annually medically cleared to be fit-tested for respiratory protection equipment. Transfers will require a two-year commitment.</p>
