50%	<p>Under the general direction and supervision of the Assistant Chief (Division Chief), the Field Battalion Chief is responsible for the coordination and management of all activities within their battalion. This individual is expected to implement, adhere to and enforce all CAL FIRE and Riverside County Fire policies and procedures. The Riverside Unit covers 7,208 square miles in Southern California, spanning from the greater Los Angeles area to the Arizona border. Geographically, the county is mostly desert in the central and eastern portions but has a Mediterranean climate in the western portion. The Battalions consist of rural desert, heavy urban/industrial, incorporated cities and unincorporated mixed- use areas. The western portion of the County has significant potential for catastrophic wildland fires compounded by the Wildland Urban Interface.</p> <p><u>DUTIES</u></p> <p>*Manages the assigned state and county fire stations as listed above; which requires close working relationships with city, county and state officials. *Prepares special reports for headquarters, as required. *Coordinates mutual aid programs with cooperators. *Reviews all purchase documents. *Prepares battalion property and equipment budget. *Monitors state, county and city property needs placing orders through channels. *Reviews placement of all property and adjusts as necessary to ensure optimum usage. *Monitors condition and maintenance records of all state, county and city property *Conducts administrative inspections of all stations and automotive equipment, noting condition of the fire station and equipment, maintenance records, personnel training records, issuance's, etc.*Responsible for coordinating with the Automotive Section repair and modification of all state, county and city automotive equipment.</p> <p>*These are the essential functions for this position. Essential functions are those functions that the individual who holds the position must be able to perform unaided or with the assistance of a reasonable accommodation.</p>

*Provides guidance to the Division Volunteer Reserve Program as necessary.
 *Analyzes directives and disseminates information to station personnel.
 *Maintains a duty schedule(OSS)for all battalion employees while ensuring vacation and holiday balances are kept within mandated standards. *Counsels employees and makes referrals to the Employee Assistance Program (EAP), as necessary. *Approves merit salary adjustments. *Completes reports of reviews and signs reports for other classes. *Reviews attendance reports (EPAY), absence requests and travel expense claims(CALATERS) for accuracy. *Overall supervision of a Battalion Wide Paramedic Assessment Program.

*Responds and directs activities on all wildland and structural fires and other emergency operations where chief officer coverage is required. *Ensures logistical support through appropriate means for incident personnel.
 *Maintains working relationships with other agencies involved in emergency work including but not limited to the following: California Highway Patrol, United States Forest Service (USFS), state, county and city roads and Highway Departments, Emergency Management Department, etc. *Responds to emergencies throughout the state in positions as listed in the Unit Emergency Response Directory and FIRESCOPE Plan. *Coordinates fire defense improvement maintenance and construction. *Provides sick leave and vacation coverage for other battalion chiefs. *Keeps aware of fire control problems in both rural and urban areas of the battalion.

*Coordinates the Battalion Fire Prevention Program with the Unit Fire Prevention Chief, schools, general public and water and utility companies.
 *Related activities include: Law Enforcement, review of fire drills in schools and hospitals, pre-plan inspections of target areas and buildings, supervise prevention activities of station personnel. *Reviews and approves CALFIRS.

*Coordinates with Unit training officers to provide or arrange training of all battalion personnel in the skills and knowledge necessary to successfully accomplish their tasks. *Attends training, as required. *Arranges and participates in joint training exercises with other agencies. *Review all injury and accident reports (IAPS) and recommends appropriate action.
 *Provides and encourages active support of the Unit safety program. Other duties as assigned.

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
