BRIEFLY DESCRIBE THE DIVISION/UNIT FUNCTIONS (Must be Grade 4 Waste Water Treatment) The CPO of the Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP) shall be knowledgeable of statutory requirements for sewage treatment and discharge. The CPO of the WWTP must possess and maintain a Grade IV Wastewater License issued by the California Water Resources Control Board. May be required to undergo a physical and pulmonary examination for the respirator program, participate in confined space training/entry and be certified and participate in the Backflow Prevention Program.				
GENERAL STATEMENT				
BRIEFLY (1 OR 2 sentences) DESCRIBE THE POSITION'S ORGANIZATIONAL SETTING AND MAJOR FUNCTIONS Under general direction of the Chief Engineer I, CF, the Water & Sewage Plant Supervisor, CF has responsibility for the operation of a water treatment and/or sewage treatment plant; maintains and repairs facility treatment equipment; maintains order and supervise the conduct of incarcerated persons; protects and maintains the safety of persons and property; instructs, leads and supervises incarcerated persons, and performs other related work.

40%	Oversees the operation of a water treatment and/or sewage treatment plant; directs or conducts the taking of daily tests of water and sewage in the various stages of treatment and personally makes the more involved analyses; and interprets tests and determines necessary changes in dosage and treatment processes. Maintain the raw water reservoir, dam, and potable water storage tanks. Assist in the preparation of reports regarding			

	plant operations and monitoring as required by law and regulations. Responsible for the creation and updates of Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for all functions of the plant that they are overseeing. Monitor and ensure the safety and security of the work area, materials, and tools. Regular and direct responsibility for work supervision, on-the-job training, and work performance evaluation of at least two incarcerated persons who substantially replace civil service employees for a total of at least 173 hours per pay period.
40%	Supervises or performs the cleaning, painting, and upkeep of equipment; adjusts and repairs mechanical equipment such as pumps, chlorinators, gas engines, and metering devices; operates or directs the operation of other mechanical equipment; operates equipment as a relief operator when necessary; may supervise assistants; may perform minor plumbing duties in connection with water and sewage systems. Maintain and repair pumps, motors, mechanical bar screen, clarifiers, biofilters, sand filters, chemical feed systems, chlorination and dechlorination systems, digesters, generators, process controls, flocculator, valves tanks, piping systems, and meters.
15%	Order materials and/or initiate contracts and service agreements while maintaining, understanding, and implementing all proper procurement procedures. Administer and adhere to all safety codes. Keep records of preventative maintenance and work orders. Perform other duties as requested.
5%	Perform administrative duties including, but not limited to: adhere to Department policies, rules and procedures; submit administrative requests including leave, travel, and training in a timely and appropriate manner; accurately report time, and submit timesheets by the due date.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

- CDCR does not recognize hostages for bargaining purposes. CDCR has a "NO HOSTAGE" policy, and all prison incarcerated persons, visitors, nonemployees and employees shall be made aware of this.

CONSEQUENCE OF ERROR
