40%	<p>The BATTALION CHIEF (B3314B), under the general direction of the Assistant Chief – Southern Division (D3303), is responsible for:</p> <p><b>BATTALION COVERAGE, EMERGENCY ACTIVITIES, and PUBLIC MEETINGS:</b>          *Supervision and management of the San Diego Unit Battalion 4 in a partnership with Battalion Chief B4 (Schedule "A" &amp; "B") and Chief B3314A (Schedule "A" &amp; "B"); this includes direct supervision for Fire Captains and Fire Apparatus Engineers assigned to CAL FIRE and San Diego County Fire (SDCF) facilities. *Responsible for directing both CAL FIRE and local government operations (including CAL FIRE stations and local government stations under cooperative agreement within the Battalion). *Responsible for maintaining a cohesive team of career and reserve firefighters. *Responsible for maintaining positive relations between CAL FIRE and local government districts. *Responsible for providing both quality wildland and municipal fire protection and training services within the battalion. *Remains proactive with frequent communications with other fire agencies in the Southeast Division (including but not limited to federal, tribal, and other fire agencies). *Maintains cooperative relationships with other members of the staff, and works as a team player.</p> <p>*Responds to emergency incidents as a Chief Officer and may take command of incidents when so justified or requested. *May also function in subordinate Incident Command System (ICS) positions or other assignments. *At emergency incidents, guides all decisions and activities by governing department policies and procedures including, but not limited to, the ICS and applicable training standards. *Always consider safety as the first priority in any emergency activity and ensures that others do the same. *Required to have department vehicle available for immediate response when on duty. *This is a Shift Pattern 1 position and responsible to be available in assigned "Zone" [Assigned Battalions] when on call, unless on department business outside the "Zone". *Attend community meetings on behalf of the Department throughout the Southeast Division as needed, including at night and occasionally on scheduled days off.</p> <p>*These are the essential functions for this position. Essential functions are those functions that the individual who holds the position must be able to perform unaided or with the assistance of a reasonable accommodation.</p>

The Unit expects a two-year commitment for all permanent assignments before granting transfer eligibility. May be required to work nights, weekends or holidays in support of emergency incident.
