DIVISION OVERVIEW				
<p>The primary mission of the Sierra Conservation Center (SCC) is to provide housing, programs and services for minimum and medium custody incarcerated people, to aid in their rehabilitation. SCC is responsible for the training and placement of incarcerated people in the Conservation Camp Program. SCC administers fire camps located across the State of California.</p> <p>The Plant Operations Department is to act as a service organization charged with the primary responsibility to perform preventative and corrective maintenance that will ensure the continued and proper functioning of equipment, structures, and grounds.</p>				

GENERAL STATEMENT	
<p>Under general direction of the Chief Engineer I (CE I), Stationary Engineer (SE), CF-Boiler Room 3rd Watch assumes the normal and routine duties of the Boiler operations for the Watch to be relieved. The duties include, but are not limited to, ordering fuel for the Main and Facility C boilers, operation, repairs, maintenance and preventative maintenance (PM) of high-pressure boilers and related equipment. Repair, service, and perform preventative maintenance (PM) to Boiler Room auxiliary equipment, boiler feedwater pumps, electrical motors, high and low-pressure steam piping, perform boiler feedwater tests and administer feedwater chemicals as necessary to prevent corrosion and scale to boiler internal parts, steam and condensate pipes and plant auxiliary equipment. <i>This position may also be required to perform work (within the scope of civil service classification Stationary Engineer), as needed by the institution in assisting other maintenance staff or in another area.</i></p> <p>Work hours are Thursday through Monday (1530 to 2330), RDO's Tuesday and Wednesday. This position is not eligible for an Alternate Work Week Schedule (AWWS).</p>	
% of time performing duties	Indicate the duties and responsibilities assigned to the position and the percentage of time spent on each. Group related tasks under the same percentage with the highest percentage first.
35%	Maintain institution high pressure Boiler Room, hot and cold-water supply, heating system, condensate devices and pumps, electrical and pneumatic devices and controls, inspects the plant/boiler operation hourly. The replacement and/or maintenance of lighting, electrical circuits and electrical motors (up to 550 volts) are an integral part of the duties. Perform and/or supervise assigned incarcerated people in the cleaning/housekeeping of the boiler house interior and exterior, and the surrounding area including minor painting, window replacement, etc. Participate in the Incarcerated Workers Training Incentive Program (IWTIP) timekeeping of the assigned incarcerated workers on the specific days worked.
25%	Perform preventative maintenance of boilers and related equipment. Replace, repair and rebuild steam valves and related devices in place or as bench work.
20%	Maintain accurate records of time and materials used daily in performing equipment repairs. Prepare and submit requisitions for purchasing equipment, fuel and/or repair parts.
10%	Make hourly entries into log of operational conditions and/or difficulties experienced during shift, e.g. temperatures, pressures, fuel consumption, water levels, etc. May be required to train lesser skilled and experienced staff or apprentices. Other job-related duties as required.
10%	Maintains tools and equipment in accordance with Department Operations Manual (DOM) Section 52040, Tool Control. Prepare reports, maintenance records, incarcerated people timecards/work reports and other related documentation. Attend a minimum of 40 hours combined In-Service Training and On-the-Job Training per year. Ensure Computerized Maintenance Management System (CMMS) is up to date on a daily basis; Plant Operations Work Order Sheet and Demand/Preventive Maintenance work orders to the supervisor at the end of each shift.

Set an example each day through positive and pro-social role modeling, utilizing dynamic security concepts through observation and building rapport. • Willingness to play a significant role in the collaborative efforts toward rehabilitation and public safety enhancement. • Ability to facilitate conversations as a coach and mentor, engaging in a respectful and understanding manner. • Ability to build trust, improve communication, and assist with the transformation of correctional culture. 	
SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CDCR does not recognize hostages for bargaining purposes. CDCR has a "NO HOSTAGE" policy, and all incarcerated people, visitors, non-employees and employees shall be made aware of this. • This position requires a United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Section 608 Technician Certification. It is the employee's responsibility to maintain this certification. • In addition to the above duties, you are responsible for being fully acquainted with: 	

1. California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 15.
 2. DOM Section 31020, IIPP/SDS/Code of Safe Practices.
 3. DOM Section 53130, IWTIP.
 4. DOM Section 55020, Key and Locking Devices.
 5. DOM Section 52040, Tool Control.
- Maintain order and supervise the conduct of persons committed to the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, prevent escapes and injury by these persons to themselves or others or to property. Maintain the security of working areas and work materials, inspect premises and incarcerated workers areas and items/materials in their possession (excluding physical contact) for contraband such as weapons or illegal drugs.
 - Work supervisors of incarcerated people assigned outside the security area will make frequent and irregular counts using the incarcerated person’s ID card or picture as verification of the incarcerated person’s presence. Minimum A custody incarcerated people must be seen at least once every hour, Minimum B custody incarcerated people must be seen at least once every two hours, and Medium custody incarcerated people must be under direct supervision.
 - **ADA Requirement:** Alternatives will be provided for incumbents who are unable to perform the non-essential functions of the job due to a disability covered under the Americans with Disabilities Act.
 - **Physical Requirements:** Ability to operate and utilize a computer terminal, 10-key calculator, copier/scanner/printer, and various office machines. There will be constant hearing/speech and sight when answering phones, providing direction, correctional awareness, and inspecting the work of others. Frequent sitting, fine finger dexterity, and hand/wrist movement while working on the computer and completing paperwork or handling tools; walking to and from work location and areas of responsibility. Occasional kneeling/crouching when accessing areas low to the ground; standing to supervise or inspect the work of others; bending/stooping when opening and closing valves or picking up items; lifting, carrying tools or supplies to perform maintenance; reaching in front of the body or overhead to operate controls or take items off shelves; climbing or balancing on ladders or stairs; pushing/pulling when opening and closing doors, gates or file cabinets.
 - **Working Conditions:** The SE works both indoors in a thermostatically controlled office and outdoors when projects dictate that location. When working outdoors the SE will be exposed to outdoor weather conditions and will be exposed to walking on uneven ground.

CONSEQUENCE OF ERROR

- Consequences of error may result in loss of time and could cause significant delays in program production. Such delays can result in inefficient use or misdirection of department resources resulting in the inability to meet efficiency and timeline goals, and varying degrees of negative financial impacts to the department.
