The Respiratory Care Practitioner, CF maintains order and supervises the conduct of the incarcerated and protects and maintains the safety of persons and property.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS						
40%	Provides respiratory therapy and diagnostic testing within the parameters set forth by the Respiratory Care Board of the state of California, the patient's medical condition, physicians' orders, and departmental policies, procedures, and protocols. Processes all physicians' orders and schedules appointments as required. Evaluates and documents the effectiveness or current status of respiratory therapy in the Unit Health Record and appropriate logs. Effectively communicates relevant findings to the medical and nursing staff as appropriate.					
40%	Supplies respiratory medical equipment to patients as ordered by the physician or other appropriate health care team member. Educates patients in the use of metered dose inhalers, improved breathing techniques, bronchial hygiene, and other therapeutics as necessary and cleans, checks, and monitors all respiratory equipment throughout the institution as required. Completes required Department equipment record logs and reports.					
10%	Attends and participates in Respiratory Care departmental meetings and In-Service Training. Assists with orientation of new staff. Participates in unit meetings and quality improvement activities

Provides education and hands on training to nursing staff in the administration of respiratory treatments, diagnostic procedures, medical equipment, therapeutic gases, and disease prevention as necessary. Attends all training, meetings, and seminars as needed or required. Prevents escape and injury of patients; maintains security of working areas and work materials; and inspects premises and may search patients for contraband, including weapons or illegal drugs. Performs other duties as required.
	KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES <i>Knowledge of:</i> Fundamentals of cardiopulmonary physiology, fluids, and electrolytes; recognition, interpretation, and recording of signs and symptoms of respiratory dysfunction and medication side effects, particularly those that require notification of a physician; initiation and maintenance of cardiopulmonary resuscitation and other life support procedures; prevention of contamination and of transfer of infection through appropriate aseptic techniques; mechanics of ventilation and ventilator function; principles of airway maintenance including endotracheal and tracheostomy care; effective and safe use of equipment for administering oxygen and other therapeutic gases, and for providing humidification, nebulization, and medication; pulmonary function testing and blood gas analysis; methods that assist in the removal of secretions from the bronchial tree, such as hydration, breathing and coughing exercises, postural drainage, therapeutic percussion and vibration, and mechanical clearing of the airway through proper suctioning techniques; procedures and observations to be followed during and after extubation or decannulation of artificial airways, recognition of, and attention required for, the psychological needs of the patients; basic principles of training and supervision; and basic pathology of respiratory disorders and nursing care. <i>Ability to:</i> Perform various respiratory therapy procedures safely and effectively; apply emergency methods of cardiopulmonary resuscitation; employ appropriate tests and measures for evaluation of pulmonary dysfunction and to properly interpret results; obtain the confidence and cooperation of patients; and analyze situations accurately and take appropriate action. LICENSE REQUIREMENT A license to practice Respiratory Care issued by the Respiratory Care Board of California. Must also possess a current Basic Life Support Certification (BLS).
