 \*Develops and updates annually battalion contributions to the Unit Fire Plan. Actively participates in Public Resources Code – Fire Safe Regulations (PRC – 4290) and Public Resources Code – Defensible Space (PRC – 4291) programs. \*Develops and annually reviews incident base plans within battalion boundaries, including agreements. \*Obtains and/or maintains required Incident Command System (ICS) certifications and qualifications, hazardous materials, Emergency Medical Services (EMS) training, and any other applicable job-required certifications and qualifications.

***Emergency Operations***  
 \*Maintains the safety and welfare of all firefighters and public in all operations and decisions as a top priority. \*Assumes command of all emergency incidents within the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) jurisdiction in designated operational area of response unless relieved of duty or delegated to competent designee. \*Responds to emergency assignments outside of operational area as requested and function in the capacity as requested. \*Maintains compliance with CAL FIRE operational protocol while assigned to other agency incidents and work closely with CAL FIRE agency representative if available.

***Special projects, other tasks, and assignments as required or assigned.***

The incumbent is required to wear respiratory protection equipment including self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA). The use of such equipment may place a physiological burden on the incumbent that varies with the type of equipment used, the job and workplace conditions in which the equipment is used, and the medical status of the incumbent. As such, California Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OSHA) requires that the incumbent be annually medically cleared to be fit-tested for respiratory protection equipment. This clearance process consists of a comprehensive medical evaluation including a review of the incumbent's medical history, a complete physical examination, and vision, hearing, spirometry, and exercise treadmill test.

The incumbent typically is required to perform psychologically stressful and/or physically demanding duties consistent with firefighting, disaster response, and emergency medical response, including working in isolated areas, walking or running on uneven rough terrain, and remaining on duty 24 hours or longer without a break while performing these duties.

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Job qualifications and/or conditions of employment: **Position may require a two (2) year commitment. May be subject to working nights, weekends, or holidays.**
