FUNCTION OF POSITION

Under the direction of the Public Safety Dispatch Supervisor I, the Public Safety Dispatcher is responsible for performing a variety of dispatching duties for the Capitol Communications Center (CCC). The CCC is a 24-hour central dispatching point for the Capitol Protection Section (CPS). In addition to dispatching California Highway Patrol (CHP) field units, the CCC works closely with the California State Assembly and Senate Sergeant at Arms within the California State Capitol, Legislative Office Building, and Capitol Swing Space.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED

The Public Safety Dispatcher reports directly to and receives the majority of their assignments from the Public Safety Dispatch Supervisor I. However, direction and assignments may also come from the Public Safety Dispatch Supervisor II.

WORKING CONDITIONS

The CCC is located within the California State Capitol Swing Space. Other occupants of the building include the Governor's office and California State Legislature; therefore, a high degree of confidentiality and professionalism are required. The CCC is a small center that handles a large volume of calls and dispatches high-profile events, requiring increased urgency and the ability to effectively manage stress. This position is mostly sedentary.

SPECIAL PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS

Consistently reports to work on time with a minimum of absences; willingness to work nights, weekends, holidays, overtime, and at unusual hours is required; has emotional stability and even temperament; willingness and initiative to take independent action; performs tasks accurately; positive attitude; adapts to shifting demands of the job; performs effectively under stress and time pressure; tolerates a confined work space with sitting and/or standing for prolonged periods; shows interest in serving the public; shows respect and consideration for others; maintains confidentiality of information; works productively without supervision; dependable; self-motivated; mature; and a team-player.

PERCENTAGE OF TIME PERFORMING DUTIES

Essential Functions

30%	Dispatch CHP field units assigned to the CPS, Judicial Protection Section (JPS), Dignitary Protection Section (DPS), and Governor's Protective Detail (GPD), as well as various Guest Users. In accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and the CHP, operate and monitor multiple radio frequencies, using the radio console, handheld radio, or base station. Operate the Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) system and document pertinent information. Make queries and entries into the California Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (CLETS), CLETS Electronic Record Tracking (CERT), and other law enforcement databases.
30%	Receive and handle landline 9-1-1 calls from State facilities in the Sacramento region. Receive and handle public 1-800-TELL-CHP calls. Receive and handle emergency calls from the Emergency Call Boxes located throughout the Capitol Park and various State parking facilities. Receive and handle Text-to-9-1-1 messages. Create CAD logs for all calls and document pertinent information. Perform inquiries, entries, and modifications into law enforcement databases.
10%	Monitor fire, panic, burglary, and motion sensor alarm systems for the California State Capitol, Legislative Office Building (LOB), Capitol Annex Swing Space, and various State facilities within the CPS jurisdiction. Receive and handle calls from alarm monitoring companies for various State facilities.
10%	Monitor the video security systems for the California State Capitol, LOB, and Capitol Annex Swing Space. Operate electronic security barricades and operating systems.
5%	Work closely with the California State Assembly and Senate Sergeants at Arms during incidents on or around the Capitol Complex. Initiate Everbridge communications to employees and contractors of the California State Capitol, LOB, and Capitol Swing Space.

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5%	Handle CLETS entries for the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) and the California Exposition & State Fair Police.
5%	Prepare reports and make proper notifications in the event of equipment failures. Attend and complete departmental and work related trainings. Participate in CHP recruiting events. Provide training to newly assigned personnel. Assist other CHP Communications Centers during emergencies.

5%	Perform other duties, within the scope of the classification, as assigned.
