Under the direction of the Chief Medical Executive and the supervision of the Correction Health Services Administrator I/II, Correctional Facility (CF), the Radiologic Technologist, CF instructs and prepares patients for radiologic examinations and takes x-rays for a variety of body structures. The Radiologic Technologist maintains equipment and quarters and keeps records and files. The Radiologic Technologist, CF may supervise the incarcerated-workers and the conduct of patients in treatment.

	ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS					
45%	Provides a full range of radiographic services, including scheduling all onsite/offsite examinations, digital images, and fluoroscopy; surgery and portables to the general population; hospital; hospice incarcerated/patients. Explains the process and prepares patients for radiological procedures. Ensures the proper and appropriate exam images are produced for the radiologist. Determines the most accurate positioning of the patient; selects the correct techniques and patient assessments. Performs quality radiographic procedures utilizing <i>As Low As Reasonably Achievable (ALARA)</i> principles through proper technique selection, shielding, and collimation.					
25%	Performs authorized x-ray procedures in accordance with the radiologist's protocols. Maintains					

15% 10% 5%	order by supervising the conduct of patients who are in the x-ray area for procedures as “in” or “out” patients. Cleans and maintains all equipment. Maintains security in area of responsibility; accurately keeping statistics as required. Ensures all protective lead shielding is inspected and replaced as needed. Provides radiology information to physicians when necessary. Keeps preventative maintenance records on all x-ray equipment and ensures necessary repairs, and services and regulatory licenses are current. Prepares reports as needed. Protects and maintains safety of persons and property. Maintains control over items such as keys, needles, and x-ray equipment and maintains proper documentation in a log of the equipment and supplies. Attends annual In-Service Training. Maintains professional licensure/ certification by attending continuing medical education as required. Performs other duties as required.
	KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES <i>Knowledge of:</i> Modern radiologic equipment and techniques; regional and gross anatomy of the human body; standardized radiologic procedures; thorough knowledge of the hazards of radiologic materials and the safety precautions required; the operation and care of modern radiologic equipment; and the ordering and storing of supplies. <i>Ability to:</i> Communicate effectively at a level required for successful job performance; administer emergency aid for shock; prepare solution used in processing x-ray film and process film; keep simple records, file film correctly, and compile reports; follow directions; analyze situations accurately and take effective action; and establish and maintain cooperative working relationships with others. Operate Radiological Information System/Picture Archiving and Communication System, Electronic Health Record System, and other electronic medical record devices. CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENT Possession of a current valid certificate as a certified Radiologic Technologist in diagnostic radiologic technology issued by the California State Department of Health Services. SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS OR CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENT • CCHCS does not recognize hostages for bargaining purposes. CCHCS and CDCR have a “NO HOSTAGE” policy and all incarcerated patients, visitors, nonemployees, and employees shall be made aware of this. SPECIAL PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS Persons appointed to this position must be reasonably expected to have and maintain sufficient strength, agility, and endurance to perform during stressful (physical, mental, and emotional) situations encountered on the job without compromising their health and well-being or that of their fellow employees or that of the incarcerated. Assignments may include sole responsibility for the supervision of incarcerated and/or the protection of personal and real property.
