Under the general direction of the Chief Physician and Surgeon, the Physician and Surgeon (P&S) will serve as a subject matter expert (SME) in treatment of patients within the Integrated Substance Use Disorders Treatment (ISUDT) program, evaluate and treat patients with opiate and alcohol use disorders and assist in the development of a statewide addiction medicine program that prepares primary care providers to evaluate, refer and treat patients with substance use disorders (SUD). 60%	Evaluates patients with SUD applying diagnostic criteria and determining eligibility for medication assisted treatment (MAT), refers patients to SUD Treatment programs and other specialty areas as necessary, prescribes medications to treat SUD when applicable, and provides education to patients with opiate use and other SUD via telehealth and onsite. Orders and reviews diagnostic studies and documents care in the Electronic Health Record System (EHRS).					

25% 10% 5%	Provides consultation, communicates, advises and collaborates with primary care providers and other clinicians in the medical care of patients with SUD, especially in the context of hepatitis C, pain treatments, MAT and other care management complexities. Evaluates patients for alternative MAT agents, advises on appropriate treatment strategies, and follows/collaborates with patients identified as having complex needs. Orders alternative MAT agents as needed and co-manages all patients on alternative MAT agents. Serves as a SME to develop comprehensive evidence-based clinical guidelines and continuing medical education courses related to managing the medical aspects of SUD and MAT. Delivers education and training to medical providers and learners related to SUD and MAT. Assists with the design of documentation and decision support within the EHRS and in other clinical tools as it relates to SUD and MAT. Participates in peer review and quality improvement activities related to SUD and MAT statewide. Participates in statewide committees including but not limited to Clinical Guidelines, Continuing Education, Pharmacy and Therapeutics and workgroups. On-call duties and occasional travel to institutions and community health care organizations required. Performs other duties as directed.
	KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES <i>Knowledge of:</i> Methods and principles of internal or family medicine and skill in their application; methods and principles of surgery and skill in their application; recent developments in internal or family medicine and surgery; hospital organization and procedure; psychiatric social work, physical therapy, and the various rehabilitation therapies; and methods of diagnosing and treating mental disorders. <i>Ability to:</i> Examine, diagnose, and treat physical and mental disorders; interpret laboratory analyses and x-rays; direct the work of ancillary medical personnel; instruct in the principles and practices of general medicine and surgery; prepare and supervise the preparation of case histories; and analyze situations accurately and adopt an effective course of action. DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS Perform appropriate procedures within the P&S scope of practice and be willing to mentor and assist in training other medical staff. The ability to effectively use Telemedicine equipment and to competently work within the EHRS. A minimum of 3 years of extensive experience treating addictions (within the last 5 years). Addiction medicine boarded or board eligible with plans to attain board certification within 1 year of hire.
