GENERAL STATEMENT					
Under the general direction of Chief Engineer I, CF, the Stationary Engineer, CF, is responsible for the maintenance and operation of boilers, HVAC, refrigeration, sewer, waste and water systems, mechanical gates, doors and pneumatic systems throughout the institution.

30%	Instruct and work with skilled and unskilled incarcerated persons (IP) in the maintenance, repair and operation of boilers, heating, ventilation, air conditioning, refrigeration, sewer, waste and water systems, pumps, motors, control systems, mechanical gates, doors, pneumatic systems, and electrical troubleshooting. Maintain, repair, and operate high- and low-pressure steam and hydronic water systems throughout the institution.
15%	Maintain and repair water, laundry, and food service equipment, shop machinery and mechanical equipment.
15%	Ensure the boiler and mechanical equipment rooms are kept in a clean and orderly condition. Analyze boiler feed water samples and determine water treatment. Maintain charts and records for reporting purposes.
10%	Daily monitoring of the Computerized Maintenance Management System (CMMS) including but not limited to review of incoming corrective and preventative maintenance work tasks, detailed logging of labor hours and materials utilized to complete repairs, ensuring thorough documentation of maintenance activities.
15%	Prepare purchase requests and maintain material inventories. Ensure tool control inventories and procedures are completed. Keep work and common areas clean and neat.
10%	Maintain order and supervise the conduct of IP assigned to your work area. Maintain the security of working areas and work materials, inspect premises and search IP for contraband, maintain IP accountability and enforce security programs. Provide safety training and enforce safety regulations.
5%	Perform administrative duties including, but not limited to adhere to Department policies, rules and procedures; submit administrative requests including leave, travel, and training in a timely and appropriate manner; accurately report time and submit timesheets by the due date. Other duties as required.
SPECIAL PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS	
• Influence, change, and strengthen the community. Set an example each day through positive and pro-social role modeling, utilizing dynamic security concepts through observation and building rapport. • Willingness to play a significant role in the collaborative efforts toward rehabilitation and public safety enhancement. • Ability to facilitate conversations as a coach and mentor, engaging in a respectful and understanding manner. • Ability to build trust, improve communication, and assist with the transformation of correctional culture.
