PRIMARY DOMAIN:						
Under the supervision of the Supervising Registered Nurse II/III, Correctional Facility (CF), or Unit Supervisor (Safety), the Psychiatric Technician (PT) (Safety) organizes and provides a basic level of general nursing and behavioral and psychiatric nursing care to patients in accordance with the Mental Health Program Guide, policies and procedures, and regulations in a variety of correctional health care settings. The PT (Safety), pursuant to the PT scope of practice and in collaboration with the health care team, ensures the delivery of appropriate and timely health care to patients. The PT (Safety) provides a basic level of general nursing and behavioral and psychiatric nursing care to patients under valid authorization by a provider's order and the delegation and clinical direction of the Registered Nurse (RN). The PT (Safety) serves as a designated member of the institution's Crisis Intervention Team (CIT), an interdisciplinary team established pursuant to departmental policy. The PT (Safety) provides emergent, in-person response during CIT events by collection of objective and subjective findings and provides intervention services to patients experiencing acute psychiatric distress, including suicidal ideation, self-injurious behavior, psychosis, severe mood or anxiety symptoms, trauma-related symptoms, and behavioral decompensation, as close to the patient's housing unit as operationally feasible, in collaboration with mental health clinicians, custody supervisory staff, and in consultation with psychiatry.

	ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS					
40%	Provides a basic level of general nursing and behavioral and psychiatric nursing care consistent with the PT scope of practice and as authorized by physicians, RNs, and other health care providers to patients assigned to a PIP. Closely monitors mental status of patients to reduce the risk of injury to self and others. Performs basic nursing procedures, administers prescribed medications, and documents medications and treatments administered. Performs disease prevention and infection prevention and control for all patients in all settings. Performs point of care testing such as basic visual or auditory acuity tests, finger stick glucose tests, and tuberculosis skin tests. Obtains specimens for diagnostic testing in compliance with CCHCS policies and procedures. Obtains and documents clinical data such as vital signs, height, weight, and observations of patient behavior and					

	overall health and mental health status and reports results to the RN or appropriate health care providers. Observes and monitors the patient for subtle or overt signs and symptoms of mental illness and the patient's response to mental health treatment including psychotropic medication, symptom management, and ability to perform activities of daily living. Conducts therapy modules, group therapy procedures, and clinical rounds, which may include suicide precautions or suicide watch. Effectively manages patient behavior in a therapeutic manner. Observes and monitors patient's behavior, provides behavior interventions, assists with activities of daily living, and reports significant changes to the treatment team. Educates and coaches patient in self-care, wellness, symptom, and disease management. Documents nursing care and observations of patient status in the patient health records and implements physician/provider orders. Serves as a patient advocate.
40%	Participates in the Interdisciplinary Treatment Team (IDTT) meetings and effectively communicates with all disciplines involved in the care of the patient. Assists the RN and PIP care team in the development and implementation of an individualized Treatment Plan. Collaborates with the IDTT to prevent or delay onset of chronic disease and mental health decompensation, and to coordinate care to achieve optimal clinical and quality of life outcomes. Escalates clinical abnormalities or behavioral concerns to the appropriate RN or provider. Utilizes decision support tools such as master registry, patient summaries, scheduling and diagnostics reports, and other tools to monitor effectiveness of treatment planning, and adjusts course in care in collaboration with the PIP care team. Communicates to the appropriate members of the mental health care team and collaborates with others to promote compliance, continuity, and quality of program, and patient care. Maintains appropriate accountability of inventory, equipment, and supplies. Restocks and orders necessary supplies and equipment, and elevates barriers to supervisor.
10%	Attends all trainings, meetings, and committees as directed by the Chief Nurse Executive (CNE) or designee. Participates in quality improvement activities such as chart reviews, audits, and participation on the Quality Improvement Team. Assists in the development, revision, and implementation of all policies and procedures as directed by the CNE or designee.
5%	Maintains a safe and secure work environment and follows all safety precautions and CCHCS policies and procedures. Reports any unsafe equipment or inappropriate conduct and/or activity to management.
5%	Performs other related duties as required.
	KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES <i>Knowledge of:</i> Fundamentals of nursing care, including medication administration; general nursing procedures and techniques involved in patient care; general behavioral and mental health principles and techniques involved in the care and treatment of individual or groups of developmentally or mentally disordered patients; fundamentals of infection prevention and control; medical terminology; and principles of effective verbal, written, and group communications. <i>Ability to:</i> Perform nursing skills and procedures as regulated by licensure and certification; observe and document symptoms and behavior; maintain records and prepare reports; establish effective therapeutic relationships and gain the interest, respect, and cooperation of patients; work effectively with patients and IDTT; function effectively in an emergency situation; and practice standard precautions. LICENSURE REQUIREMENT Active California Psychiatric Technician License in good standing. EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENT Complete continuing education as required for maintenance of a valid license to practice as a PT

issued by the California Board of Vocational Nurse and Psychiatric Technicians and as a condition of employment (40 hours of In-Service Training and on-the-job training annually).

ADDITIONAL ESSENTIAL REQUIREMENTS

Ability to work mandated overtime hours as needed.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS OR CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENT

CCHCS does not recognize hostages for bargaining purposes. CCHCS and CDCR have a "NO HOSTAGE" policy and all incarcerated patients, visitors, nonemployees, and employees shall be made aware of this.

SPECIAL PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS

Persons appointed to this position must be reasonably expected to have and maintain sufficient strength, agility, and endurance to perform during stressful (physical, mental, and emotional) situations encountered on the job without compromising their health and well-being or that of their fellow employees or that of the incarcerated.

Assignments may include sole responsibility for the supervision of the incarcerated and/or the protection of personal and real property.

SPECIAL PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS

- Influence change and strengthen the community. Set an example each day through positive and pro-social role modeling, utilizing dynamic security concepts.
- Willingness to play a significant role in the collaborative efforts toward rehabilitation and public safety enhancement.
- Ability to facilitate conversations as a coach and mentor, engaging in a respectful and understanding manner.
- Ability to build trust, improve communication, and assist with the transformation of correctional culture.
- Empathetic understanding of patients of a State correctional facility; willingness to work in a State correctional facility; emotional stability; patience; tact; alertness; and keenness of observation.
- Demonstrated leadership ability.
