Under the direction of the Supervising Dentist, Correctional Facility or the Prison Industries Superintendent II (Dental Laboratory), the Industrial Supervisor, Prison Industries (Dental Laboratory) is responsible for the production and the fabrication of prosthetic devices for incarcerated persons in a dental laboratory within a correctional facility.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS						
35%	Supervises and coordinates the activities of incarcerated workers responsible for the fabrication, assembly and repair of full or partial dentures. Constructs full and partial dentures in accordance with the instructions of a dentist. Reads prescriptions and consults with dentists to resolve problems or questions concerning prescription specifications. Trains new incarcerated workers on existing dental laboratory workflow; makes recommendations to increase production efficiency and product quality of the prosthetic devices; assigns dental prosthetic cases to incarcerated workers; inspects work in progress and upon completion to ensure conformance to prescription specifications.					
30%	Maintains order and supervises the conduct of incarcerated workers committed to the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation in the dental laboratory. Tracks the use of dental tools/equipment by incarcerated workers and completes daily tool control forms. Ensures incarcerated workers report to the designated laboratory workstation. Responsible for complying with all regulations of the Incarcerated Work Incentive Program including maintaining incarcerated person timesheets, conducting performance reviews and initiating disciplinary action if needed.					
20%	Provides training and direction to incarcerated workers on the proper use of dental equipment, handling of contaminated materials, safety, and tool control procedures. Replaces teeth in dentures as prescribed by a dentist. Packs acrylic resin and processes with heat. Removes dentures from flasks and molds, and finishes them to a smooth, glossy state without changing denture contour.					

15%	Tracks incoming and outgoing dental prosthetic cases; inspects all incoming packages for contraband and to document all incoming cases; inspects all outgoing packages to ensure cases have been completed properly. Assists in the procurement of dental laboratory supplies and raw materials. Implements the individual components of the Incarcerated Work Incentive Program. Trains and motivates incarcerated workers in personal development through their participation in the program.
	KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES <i>Knowledge of:</i> Dentistry methods, materials, machinery, processes, tools, and equipment used in a dental laboratory. Production scheduling and control; quality standards and control; safety practices and orders; materials handling techniques; principles of personnel management and supervision. <i>Ability to:</i> Set up, repair, maintain, adjust, and operate required equipment; make labor and material estimates; instruct and supervise staff and incarcerated workers in production techniques and safety practices; maintain firm, impartial, and consistent discipline; understand rules, regulations, laws, and procedures; analyze situations accurately and take effective action; keep records and prepare reports; communicate effectively at a level required for successful job performance. DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS Dental laboratory experience within a correctional facility; certification as a Dental Laboratory Technician by the National Board for Certification; completion of a dental technology program accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation. Supervisory experience; education equivalent to completion of twelfth (12) grade; and assertiveness. Tact, patience, and ability to work with persons confined in a correctional institution. OTHER DOMAINS SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS OR CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENT - CCHCS does not recognize hostages for bargaining purposes. CCHCS and CDCR have a "NO HOSTAGE" policy and all incarcerated patients, visitors, nonemployees, and employees shall be made aware of this.
