BRIEFLY DESCRIBE THE POSITION'S ORGANIZATION SETTING AND MAJOR FUNCTIONS

Under the supervision of the Senior Environmental Scientist Supervisor, the Limited Term Fish and Wildlife Technician will support the North Yuba River Spring-Run Chinook Salmon Reintroduction Program operations. The incumbent will be responsible for installation, inspection, maintenance, repair, and operation of sampling equipment and gear including rotary screw traps, radio receivers, acoustic receivers, hydraulic egg injectors, egg boxes and other sampling equipment; maintenance and repair of vehicles, vessels, and trailers; and assisting in the collect of environmental and biological data as appropriate/needed. May work under the lead of Environmental Scientists.

40%	<u>ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:</u> FIELD SITE OPERATIONS: The incumbent will support salmon monitoring efforts for the North Yuba River Spring-Run Chinook Salmon Reintroduction Program. The incumbent will be responsible for: assembly, transport, set-up, installation, breakdown, and debris removal of rotary screw traps, radio receivers, acoustic receivers, hydraulic egg injectors, egg boxes, and other sampling equipment; safe operation of vehicles, trailers, vessels, pumps, pulleys, winches, hand tools, power equipment, and other essential operating equipment; and assist in the collection of biological and environmental data. May handle salmonids and other fish species during sampling and occasionally assist with salmon tagging efforts.
25%	MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR: During the monitoring season, the incumbent will be responsible for performing daily inspection, maintenance, repairs, and adjustments of rotary screw traps, and other sampling equipment and gear to ensure functional, safe and efficient operation. Incumbent will also make routine inspections, perform maintenance and repairs, of vessels, vehicles, trailers, and other essential operating equipment using a variety of tools and equipment. Between monitoring seasons, the incumbent will perform maintenance and repairs to prepare sampling equipment and gear for the upcoming field season. Repairs may also include minor welding, cleaning, sanding, painting, drilling, riveting using various tools, and equipment.
20%	OPERATIONAL COORDINATION: Work collaboratively with seasonal staff, under the direction of the project lead Environmental Scientist, to support daily operational priorities of salmon monitoring efforts. Communicate observed needs related to construction, fabrication, repair, and maintenance of sampling equipment and gear to the lead Environmental Scientist and Senior Environmental Scientists. Maintain maintenance schedules and records for sampling equipment and gear, vessels, vehicles, and trailers, and report major mechanical issues, debris loads, and safety concerns to supervisory staff.

5%	NON-ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS: Interact with the public and respond to questions and describe salmon monitoring activities. Participation in public outreach events may be required. Special Personal Characteristics: • Aptitude for fish and wildlife conservation work, construction, repair, and maintenance work; ability to operate boats and tow trailers; willingness to travel to perform field work throughout the State; and willingness to work irregular hours and on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays. Interpersonal Skills: • Excellent communication and problem-solving skills, get along well with others, and work both independently and in a team environment; have keenness of observation; and be reliable. Ability to interact with the public and maintain a high level of professional integrity. Special Physical Characteristics: • Ability to swim 50 yards and stay afloat for at least five minutes; maintain good physical condition; elevate 40 pounds; work outdoors in various weather conditions; work in and around water (including wading and snorkeling). WORKING CONDITIONS: Will work outdoors in all weather conditions, in and around cold and fast-moving water, and on uneven terrain. Will be required to travel to different work locations on the Sacramento River Watershed utilizing a state vehicle. Must possess a valid Driver License. Will regularly drive state vehicles, boats, and trailers. Incumbent may be required to obtain a California Boater Card. Will be required to work weekends and holidays. A uniform and appropriate safety gear will be required to be worn daily. Workspace will be provided in an office/warehouse as necessary and appropriate. This position will be based out of the Rancho Cordova office and will require frequent travel in a state vehicle, to the North Yuba River, near Downieville, CA. NO STATE HOUSING IS AVAILABLE.
