Under the direction of the Public Safety Dispatch Supervisor I (PSDS I), the Public Safety Dispatcher is responsible for operations of the communications equipment to provide communications service to the mobile units and the public for the Chico Communications Center..

SUPERVISION RECEIVED

The Public Safety Dispatcher reports directly to and receives the majority of their assignments from the Public Safety Dispatch Supervisor I. However, direction and assignments may also come from the Public Safety Dispatch Supervisor II, Lieutenant and/or Captain.

PERCENTAGE OF TIME PERFORMING DUTIES

Essential Functions

50%	Operates voice radio in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated by Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and the California Highway Patrol (CHP). Relays All Points Bulletins to all mobile units. Receives and documents verbal messages/requests from field units and takes appropriate action to fulfill those requests. Coordinates pursuits and high risk incidents with allied agencies. Documents all essential traffic into the Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) or on radio cards and takes the appropriate action. Receives overflow requests for emergency service from the general public and other agencies via 911 cellular, 911 transfers, and allied agency telephone lines. Dispatches appropriate units or services without unreasonable delay. Documents actions on CAD logs.
40%	Operates service desk telephone position in accordance with the rules, regulations and agreements of the CHP. Receives requests for emergency and routine service from the general public and other agencies via 911 cellular, 911 transfer, allied agencies, call box calls, media calls, calls from the public, and calls from CHP personnel. May be assigned to a Service Desk position. Handles requests from the radio position relayed from the field. Documents pertinent information received from incoming and outgoing telephone. Enters information regarding incarcerations, injury, and fatal traffic accidents into the CHP 144, Incarcerated-Injury-Vehicle Report, Locator System, Be On the Look Out (BOLO system). Enters information regarding stored, stolen, and recovered vehicles into the California Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (CLETS).
5%	When assigned, may assume lead responsibility for an entire shift as the Public Safety Dispatcher in Charge (PSDIC) in the absence of the Public Safety Dispatch Supervisor I.
