MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

All applicants must meet the education and/or experience requirements as stated on this exam bulletin to be accepted into the examination. Part-time or full-time jobs, regardless of whether paid or volunteer positions, and inside or outside California state service will count toward experience.

HEAVY TRUCK DRIVER

Possession of a driver license valid for the operation of any combination of vehicles. Applicants who do not possess this license will be admitted to the examination but must secure the license prior to appointment. and Experience: One year of experience (within the last ten years) in operating heavy compound transmission motor truck tractors with semitrailer or heavy motor truck and trailer equipment.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

HEAVY TRUCK DRIVER

Under supervision, to operate heavy compound transmission motor truck tractors or trucks with semitrailer or other trailer equipment; to perform related laboring work; may instruct, lead, or supervise inmates, wards, or resident workers; and to do other related work.

EXAMINATION SCOPE

This examination consists of the following components:

Training and Experience Evaluation – Weighted 100% of the final score.

The examination will consist solely of a **Training and Experience Evaluation**. To obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum score of 70% must be received. Applicants will receive their score upon completion of the Training and Experience Evaluation process.

In addition to evaluating applicants' relative knowledge, skills, and ability, as demonstrated by quality and breadth of education and/or experience, emphasis in each

exam component will be measuring competitively, relative job demands, each applicant's:

KNOWLEDGE OF:

- Operation and servicing requirements of heavy motor truck tractor with semitrailer or heavy motor truck and trailer equipment using compound transmissions.
- 2. Provisions of the California Vehicle Code applying to the operation of vehicles on the highway.

ABILITY TO:

- 1. Recognize and take necessary precautions against hazardous driving conditions.
- 2. Drive in a smooth, careful, and safe manner.
- 3. Detect motor trouble and to take prompt precautions to avoid breakdowns and damage to trucks and cargo.
- 4. Make adjustments and emergency repairs to equipment operated.
- 5. Properly load and unload equipment and when necessary to direct helpers.
- 6. Follow oral and written directions.
- 7. Keep necessary records and make reports.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION

A service wide, open eligible list for the Heavy Truck Driver classification will be established for the State of California (all State of California departments, statewide).

The names of successful competitors will be merged onto the eligible list in order of final score regardless of exam date. Eligibility expires **one (1) year** after it is established. Applicants must then retake the examination to reestablish eligibility.

Veterans' Preference will be granted for this examination. In accordance with Government Codes 18973.1 and 18973.5, whenever any veteran, or widow or widower of a veteran achieves a passing score on an open examination, he or she shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligible list.

Veterans status is verified by the California Department of Human Resources (CalHR). Information on this program and the Veterans' Preference Application (Std. form 1093) is available online. Additional information on veteran benefits is available at the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Career Credits will not be granted in this examination.

If you meet the requirements stated on this examination bulletin, you may take this examination, which is competitive. Possession of the entrance requirements does not assure a place on the eligible list. Your performance in the examination described in this bulletin will be rated against a predetermined job-related rating, and all applicants who pass will be ranked according to their score.

The California Department of Human Resources (CalHR) reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service, if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service laws and rules and all applicants will be notified.

General Qualifications: Applicants must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgement, the ability to work cooperatively with others, and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required. In open examinations, investigation may be made of employment records and personal history and fingerprinting may be required.

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) servicewide promotional, 5) departmental open, 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in one to four years unless otherwise stated on the bulletin.

High School Equivalence: Equivalence to completion of the 12th grade may be demonstrated in any one of the following ways: 1) passing the General Education Development (GED) Test; 2) completion of 12 semester units of college-level work; 3) certification form the State Department of Education, a local school board, or high school authorities that the competitor is considered to have education equivalent to graduation from high school; or 4) for clerical and accounting classes, substitution of business college work in place of high school on a year-for-year basis.
